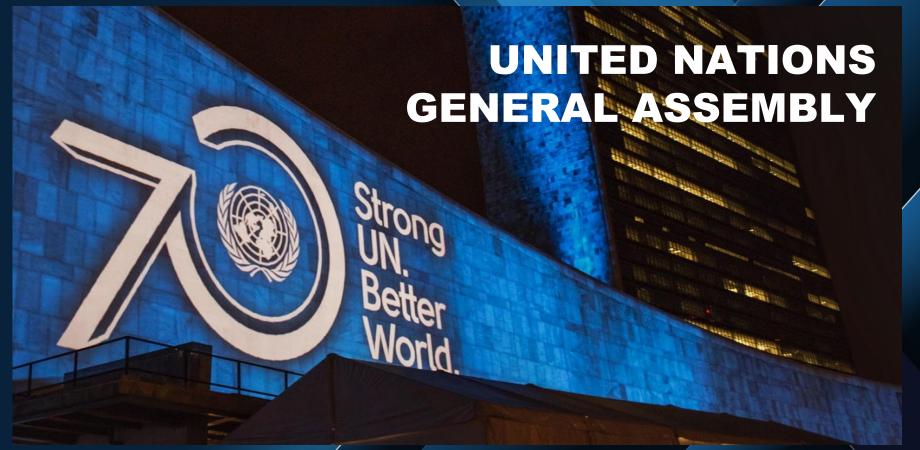

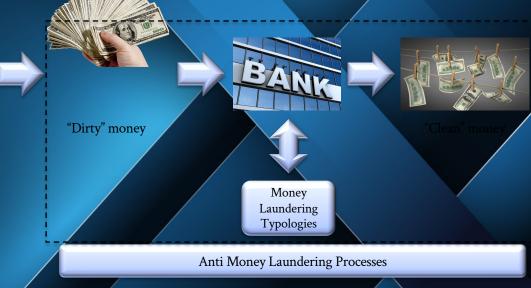


Component analysis

Leader - Plantium Level 3

Executive and Board Leadership: The Company's antimodern slavery policies are approved by senior management and the board of directors.

The Platinum Freedom Seal levels reserved for those select companies that (1) qualify for the Silver and Gold Freedom Seal, and that have (2) taken the additional step of conducting a risk-based audit of their key suppliers to help ensure that their supply chain is free from the taint of human trafficking and slavery.

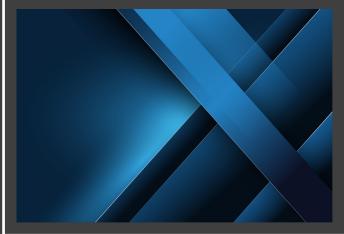
