



Julie Preuitt is a Senior Special Advisor in the SEC's Office of International Affairs, where she participates in the SEC's international technical assistance program. Julie has conducted training all over the world in person as well as virtually.

Prior to joining OIA, Julie served as an Assistant Regional Director in the SEC's EXAM Division, supervising both broker-dealer and investment advisor examinations out of the SEC's Fort Worth, Texas office. During her 25 years in the EXAM Division, Julie focused on identifying fraudulent activities that threaten individual investors as well as the market as a whole. Notable examples include Julie's work on identifying risks that were instrumental in the development of FINRA's day-trading rules, identifying fraudulent sales practices to the military which resulted in Congress outlawing a securities product that helped to facilitate those abuses, and identifying the Stanford International Ponzi scheme as well as fighting for justice for the victims.
